



IN THE BOOTS OF A ROBBER - Almond Coonrod

Editor: The following story was taken from the 1909 Yreka White and Gold high school yearbook. Whether this is a fictional story or actual happening is up to the reader to decide!

In the Boots of a Robber...

I was hard at work plowing the fields on my father's farm one spring when a stranger, a man of about fifty rode up to me on horseback and asked me to go with him as a guide to Hangsley's Ford. I hesitated, but when he offered good pay for my services, I promised to go. What on earth does the man want to go there for, I thought. Surely he can't be going fishing, for the season has not opened yet.

I took him to the very spot he wanted. He looked at the creek a moment, then cutting a long willow pole with his pocket-knife, he began to prod beneath an old log which lay across the stream near by. The pole stuck something that sounded like a tin can. A happy smile flushed his face. He fished it out and pulled off the lid. It was level full with shining gold nuggets. I could hold my questions no longer, and when I had promised again and again never to tell anyone his secret, we seated ourselves on the old log and he told the following story: "It was in the early days when I was a lad of eighteen. I was prospecting along the banks of this very stream. One day I was lounging during my noon hour beneath the shade of that old dead willow, which was then alive in its prime, when I noticed upon the grassy creek bank a little patch of withered grass, which looked as if the sod had been lifted and replaced. I was curious to know what it meant; so with my shovel I lifted the loosened sod and dug in the soft earth underneath. I struck a tin can. Indeed, it was the very same tin can which I have now."

I knew the whole story. Only a few days before a rich old miner, who lived about a mile up the creek, had been robbed and murdered. Everybody as well as I knew the old baking powder can in which he stored his treasure. The thief had sought to hide it beneath the sod, but the withered grass had betrayed him."

"The old miner had no relatives as far as anyone knew. He was an old bachelor who lived by himself and took pleasure in keeping his gold, 'Surely,' I thought, 'it would be better for me to keep his gold than let the thief who murdered him have it! But I must not be seen with that old baking powder can, and I must melt these old familiar nuggets which he was so fond of showing his friends.'

"I was just beginning to rejoice at my luck when suddenly I heard the clattering of hoofs and baying of bloodhounds. For the first time I realized my danger, and now I must play the part of the robber! The hounds tracing the cold tracks of the thief had crossed the warm scent of my innocent trail, and were fast tracing it to the spot where the can of gold would identify me as the criminal."
